### Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport (PHF) TARMAC DELAY CONTINGENCY PLAN

The Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport has prepared this Tarmac Delay Contingency Plan pursuant to §42301 of the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012. The Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport is filing this plan with the Department of Transportation because (1) it is a commercial airport or (2) this airport may be used by an air carrier described in USC 42301(a)(1) for diversions.

This plan describes how, following excessive tarmac delays and to the extent practicable, the Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport will:

- Provide for the deplanement of passengers;
- Provide for the sharing of facilities and make gates available at the airport; and
- Provide a sterile area following excessive tarmac delays for passengers who have not yet cleared United States Customs & Border Protection (CBP).

The Newport News/ Williamsburg International Airport has facility constraints that limit its ability to accommodate diverted flights. The airport strongly encourages aircraft operators to contact the Airport Operations Department at (757) 234-0568 for prior coordination of diverted flights, except in the case of a declared in-flight emergency. This phone number is monitored 24 hours a day.

Specific facility constraints include the following: limited sterile area space, limited passenger holding space, limited fueling capacity, limited food and beverage services, and limited direct jet bridge access to the terminal facilities. The airport has noted these constraints in the Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport/Facility Directory record. During diversion events the Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport issues NOTAMs regarding its ability to accommodate diverted flights to ensure the safe and efficient operation of the airport and its ability to serve the civil aviation needs of the public.

# Plan to Provide for the Deplanement of Passengers Following Excessive Tarmac Delays

The Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport has ample ramp space to accommodate diverted aircraft, and the airport has the ability to transport passengers via shuttle bus to the terminal facility. However, the airport does not own or operate any of the equipment needed to safely deplane passengers from air carrier aircraft and is, therefore, unable on its own to provide for the deplanement of passengers. Additionally airport personnel are not trained to assist in the deplanement of passengers using equipment owned or operated by air carriers or contract service providers. The airport will provide a list of airlines, ground handlers, fixed base operators, and others who may have the necessary equipment and personnel to safely deplane passengers to airlines as soon as practicable after receiving requests from such airlines experiencing excessive tarmac delays at the contact number listed above.

## Plan to Provide for the Sharing of Facilities and Make Gates Available in an Emergency

The gates at Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport are under preferential lease to air carriers and are not fully controlled by the airport. During those time periods when the tenant's usage of that gate meets the usage specified in the preferential use lease, the airport may be able to direct a tenant airline to accommodate another air carrier aircraft at its preferentially leased gate. The airport will direct its tenant air carriers to make gates and other facilities available to an air carrier seeking to deplane at a gate during those time periods the gates are not in use or not scheduled to be in use, to the maximum extent practicable.

# Plan to Provide a Sterile Area for Passengers Who Have Not Cleared United States Customs and Border Protection

The Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport does have international passenger processing facilities. The facility has a capacity of approximately 100 passengers. The airport will coordinate with local CBP officials if an international aircraft arrives and ensure no persons exit the aircraft until CBP officials have cleared the aircraft.
